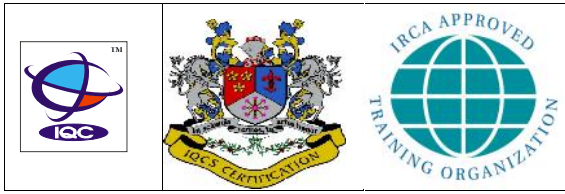

 - ✓ To communicate any changes in EMS specific requirements arising as a result of transitioning from ISO 14001/2004 to ISO 14001/2015

 1. Auditing environmental management system requirements
 - 1.1 Verify that the scope is available as documented information to relevant interested parties and that it reflects the organisation's:
 - 1.1.1 Organisational unit(s), function(s) and physical boundaries.
 - 1.1.2 Activities, products and services.
 - 1.1.3 Authority and ability to exercise control and influence.
 - 1.2 Verify that the environmental policy includes a commitment to the protection of the environment, with prevention of pollution.
 - 1.3 Verify that documented information is maintained, containing:
 - 1.3.1 Criteria used to determine the significant environmental aspects.



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- 1.3.2 Environmental aspects associated with environmental impacts.
- 1.4 Evaluate the indicators for monitoring progress toward achievement of measurable environmental objectives.
- 1.5 Evaluate how the organisation:
 - 1.5.1 Determines environmental requirements for the procurement of products and services, as appropriate.
 - 1.5.2 Establishes controls to ensure that environmental requirements are considered in the design and development, as appropriate.
 - 1.5.3 Communicates relevant environmental requirement(s) to external providers, including contractors.
- 1.6 Evaluate the organisation's knowledge and understanding of conforming with compliance obligations and the trends in achieving them.
- 1.7 Verify that the management review considers the extent objectives have been achieved.
